What is learning disabilities?

Learning disabilities means a heterogeneous group of conditions where there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend speak, read, write, spell or to do mathematical calculations.

learning disabilities include:

- Dyslexia(difficulty with reading)
- Dysgraphia (difficulty with writing)
- Dcalculia (difficulty with maths)
- Dyspraxia (difficulty with fine Motor skills) Development aphasia (difficulty with language)

What learning disabilities are not:

- learning problem due to deficiency is in the sensory or motor organs and emotional or environmental issues are not considered as a learning disabilities
- learning disability is not mental retardness
- some children may not be interested in specific types of learning
- some may begin as slow learners

Can learning disability be cured?

Learning disability is not a disease and cannot be cured. However early diagnosis and ongoing intervention can improve adaptive functioning throughout one's childhood and into adulthood. With ongoing support and intervention, children with learning disabilities can learn to do many things.

How do you teach students with learning disabilities in classroom?

- Collaborate with entire team
- know that each child is unique
- identify how child learn best
- structure lesson plans to support inclusivity communicate clearly with student and parent
- break down the content allowing kids to move while learning
- provide additional rest periods
- use accommodation and modification to get to the learning targets
- make feedback immediate
