#### **“Morality describes WHAT IS and Ethics describe WHAT OUGHT TO BE.”**

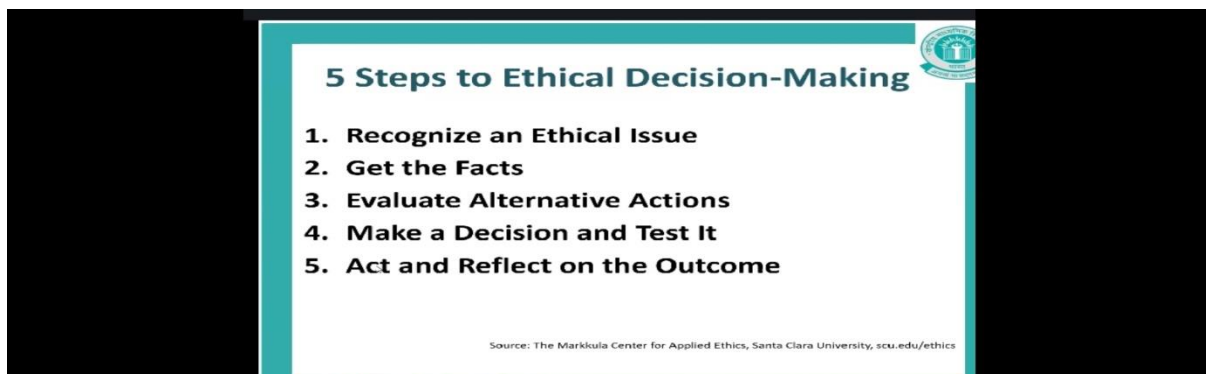

#### INTEGRITY as:

While talking on ‘INTEGRITY’, she said that “INTEGRITY is the practice of being honest and showing a strong and consistent observance of morality and values. She said, that Integrity from the point of ETHICS can be regarded as honesty and truthfulness.”

Our Resource person also talked on ETHICS Vs VALUES wherein, she described ETHICS as-

- Ethics are professional
- They are influenced by different professions, organizations, and institute etc, and Ethics can vary according to professions.

- A set of moral principles, especially ones relating to affirming a specified group, field form of conduct.



### VALUES as:

- Principles or standards of behaviour
- Values are personal
- They are influenced by family, background, culture, religion, and community etc.
- Values can vary according to the individual.
